What the Judges Want

Sound

Sync is a necessary element of <u>harmony accuracy</u> –
instant accuracy and total lock-and-ring. Lack of sync
mars a blended musical unit, prevents instantly
matched vowels and distorts a solid barbershop sound.

Music

• Sync is a necessary element of <u>musical unity</u> – occurs when all members of the ensemble sing vowels correctly and **simultaneously**, and sing chords in tune and **at the same time**. **Lack of sync** results in chords that are indistinct, incomplete, fuzzy, out of tune, lacking in clarity.

What the Judges Want

Expression

Sync is considered one of the category's <u>basic</u>
 <u>requirements</u> – the judge seeks a flawless performance of the "<u>vertical elements</u>" of the music; attacks and releases, internal phrase delivery, word delivery. <u>Lack of sync</u> prevents a consistent unit presentation.

Showmanship

 Sync is a necessary element of <u>unity</u> – the presentation must ensure that the group appears as a unit rather than a collection of individuals. <u>Lack of sync</u> results in a disjointed, ineffective presentation.

Sync Solutions

- The Buzz "Six-Step Procedure" for working a song
 - Melody helps harmony parts learn timing and lead inflections
 - Unison SUPER SYNC STRENGTHENER!
 - Attacks and releases
 - Internal sync
 - Vowels, diphthongs, consonants
 - Vowel resonance
 - All the Possible Duets helps strengthen octaves, unity in moving parts
 - 4 All the Possible Trios
 - 5 Three vs. One very helpful in choruses!
 - 6 REASSEMBLE!

Sync Summary

- Synchronization is a crucial element of the barbershop style, both musically and visually; judged in all four categories
- Know your music and the sync "traps" it may contain
- Build your basic vocal skills; many sync errors are caused by underdeveloped vocal skills
- Use rehearsal techniques that build sync awareness
- Have fun! Trying too hard is never the answer!
